MEADOW PIPIT (1) NR had two fly over on both 5th and 19th (2) On 23rd I saw 5 on the grass of the sports field with Pied Wagtails.

PIED WAGTAIL (1) NR had 9 on the sports field on 22nd and (2) I saw 5 there on 23rd.

COLLARED DOVE one heard calling in Tim Trail Copse on 17th but not seen.

MISTLE THRUSH (1) 14 on 5th with 3 on Lakeside field and 11 on sports field but (2) NR had 15 on 22nd with 8 on sports field and 7 on Bellevue field (3) 7 were on the Lakeside field on 23rd.

MANDARIN present at the Lake throughout month.

(1) NR saw 7 there on 5th (2) on 17th I saw 6 perched close next to each other on a branch overhanging the Lake near Lake Extension (3) 4 on 17th with 3 on same branch and (4) only one on Anglers' Lake on 23rd.

SHOVELER (1) 7 in eclipse on the Lake on 11th (2) 3 there on 17th and (3) 2 on 23rd.

GREY LAG GOOSE (1) NR had 11 (?) on the sports field on 22nd but (2) I only saw one there on 23rd.

CANADA GOOSE 33 (?) were on the sports field on 11th.

CORMORANT Maximal: 3 at Lake 17th, NR had 5 on 22nd and 7 there on 23rd.

OTHER REPORTED BIRDS (NR)

GREAT WHITE EGRET (!) At 7.30 am on 22nd NR saw 2 accompanied by one LITTLE EGRET fly low over the Lake and away. The three birds together were seen 20 minutes later over the Woodberry Reserve in N. London. A new bird for Wandsworth and the 125th recorded there.

GREY WAGTAIL I have yet to see one anywhere this year but NR had one at the Lake Extension on 22nd.

GOLDCREST Nick saw 3 on 22nd.

COMMON GULL He had two fly over on 22nd.

LESSER BLACK-BACK GULL He had one juvenile on the sports field on 22nd.

BIRDWALK I shall be leading a Birdwalk on Sunday 20th October. Meet 9.30 am by ticket office of the station. Should be winter migrants coming in like Redwing, Fieldfare and Siskin. October 2018 produced Teal (21st-31st) Grey Wagtail (16th/21st) Common Buzzard (21st) Siskin (21st) Fieldfare (120. 25th-NR) and Redwing.
