

Visiting Wandsworth or Battersea New (Morden) Cemetery

Updated 22 July at 12pm

Access to the grounds

Wandsworth cemetery is open to the public at our normal advertised times.

Due to operational reasons Battersea New (Morden) cemetery is open Monday to Friday 8am to 5pm and 10am to 4pm at weekends and public holidays.

The following limitations are in place until further notice.

- The pedestrian gates at the rear of Battersea New cemetery remains closed until further notice. There is no thoroughfare through the cemetery and the only access is via the main gates
- Visitors must maintain a social distance of at least 2 meters from other visitors and staff
- Sporting activities are not permitted in cemeteries by law
- Picnics or the consumption of alcohol (or the use of drugs) is not permitted
- No more than six persons (from the same family bubble) are permitted in a group
- Do not arrange to or meet with groups of friends or family in the grounds. Please note that the Police may be called to disperse large gatherings

Planning your visit.

- You must not visit if you are unwell, vulnerable or self-isolating
- Please do not approach staff, grave diggers or grounds people. Please let them carry out their work in safety. Please contact the office with any enquiries
- The toilets at Wandsworth cemetery are open during the normal advertised times. These toilets are cleaned periodically
- The toilets at Battersea New cemetery are open Monday to Friday only. Please make other arrangements at weekends and public holidays

Normal cemetery regulations continue to apply and must be adhered to and the above re-opening and restrictions will be monitored and reviewed over the coming weeks.
